

SOMERHILL PRE-PREP CLUBS AND LATE SUPERVISION - Lent Term 2012

In the Lent Term we have a range of clubs for children in Years 1 and 2 and dance classes for Reception and Kindergarten. We shall try to accommodate your first choice, but you may be offered your second choice, so please discuss this with your child.

The clubs are intended to be fun and are run so that the children build up on their previous knowledge. It is not advisable for children to “drop-in” or “drop-out” of the clubs. They will need to attend all sessions.

Please note that charges (£4.00 per club) are levied for participating in certain clubs marked * because of the cost of materials involved. Clubs marked ** are billed separately. For those children not involved in clubs, we offer Late Supervision along with the other schools at Somerhill from 3.30 p.m. (on Wednesday from 3.00 p.m.) to 6.00 p.m. There will be a charge for all pupils of £2.10 per half hour or part thereof. Charges will be levied in half-hourly time bands. Children waiting for older siblings in the schools will be allowed free after-school care up to 4.30 p.m. (3.45 p.m. on Wednesdays) the statutory end of the school day. Younger siblings remaining at school while older siblings attend a club will be charged for late supervision. Clubs start the week beginning Monday 16th January 2012.

PUPIL NAME AND YEAR GROUP Each child must have their own club/late class form.

EMERGENCY CONTACT NUMBER This is essential information and must be completed.

FIRST COLUMN of the form, please complete if applying for after-school care.

Late supervision must be on a pre-booked basis for all the children involved. Emergencies can be catered for but it is imperative that we have the appropriate staffing ratios.

SECOND COLUMN of the form, please complete if you wish to book a paid tea.

N.B. Until clubs forms have been collated, teas need to be arranged individually with the class teacher.

Also note that if your child is booked in for tea (at £1.75) and then is not present at tea-time you will be charged for the tea unless you have cancelled it before 10 a.m. that morning.
