A personalised kit bag needs to be ordered by parents directly from Stevensons via their website.

Jewellery is not allowed. One exception is a single pair of plain, round gold or silver studs in the lobe of the ear. If your child would like to get their ears pierced, we ask that this is arranged at the start of the summer holiday. This ensures that the ear has plenty of time to recover for the new school year during which earrings must be removed for all Games and PE lessons (taping them is not sufficient). If your child has pierced ears, they should be able to remove their earrings and put them on independently. Prep pupils may **only** wear an analogue or digital watch to school. Smart watches are not allowed.

All hair must be kept clean, neat and tidy. Hair must be appropriately tied back for hygiene and safety reasons especially in the Dining Hall, the Science classrooms and during games lessons. All hair bands, slides and ties should be green, blue, brown or black and discreet. Hair should not be clippered below a grade 2 or be cut or dressed in an extreme fashion to draw particular attention. This includes hair cut in the style of a mullet or with tramlines. Exceptions will be made on an individual basis on religious and cultural grounds.

Derwent Lodge pupils wear summer dresses in September. They start wearing culottes and blouses after the Michaelmas half term holiday, then summer dresses in the Trinity term. Please ensure that hemlines are at or below the knee.
